SME Climate Hub

Supporting research and advocacy for SME climate action. At COP30, the SME Climate Hub launched an open letter to governments worldwide requesting policy support for SME climate action. The letter was signed by organisations supporting six million SMEs globally.

Possible

Sharing campaigns and signing petitions directed at the UK Government to act on climate. Possible demonstrates, popularises, and campaigns for climate solutions that create systemic change in consumer-facing sectors, focusing on making low-carbon choices the most desirable option for everyone through improved public transport, renewable energy, and circular economy initiatives. voluntarily donate to their Sustainable Travel Leave initiative to which adopted in 2020 when it was called Climate Perks offering our team [extra days holiday leave](#) for opting for slow travel abroad.

National Emergency Briefing

A non-partisan initiative bringing the UK's leading climate, nature, and security experts' briefing to communities nationwide through public screenings. Following their November 2025 Westminster briefing to MPs, TBLA supported their crowdfunding campaign in 2025 to create a public information film, enabling shared understanding of the climate crisis across constituencies. Backed by the National Trust, WWF, and RSPB.

Zero Hour – Climate and Nature Bill

TBLA is a company signatory for the Climate and Nature Bill. Zero Hour campaigns for this proposed UK legislation, which addresses the full extent of the climate and nature crisis in line with current scientific evidence. The Bill represents the only proposed comprehensive and joined-up approach before the UK Parliament that:

- Ensures the UK contributes to limiting global warming to 1.5°C
- Commits to rapidly reducing greenhouse gas emissions
- Reverses biodiversity loss by 2030 (compared to the Environment Act's commitment merely to halt nature's decline by 2030)

Corporate sponsorship
